We reserve the right to refuse solely self-promotional articles.

Many of our readers use the journal for practical advice and idea generation for project planning. To meet these needs, we would like all submissions to answer the following questions:

- What key lessons were learnt during the project, i.e. what worked and didn't work?
- What would you do differently next time?
- What steps will you take to sustain the project?
- What's the project's legacy?

Text to include:

- A short introductory paragraph to serve as a summary of article
- A short, punchy main title (up to 5 words)
- Short subtitles to break up text (3-5 words each)
- Short biographical details about you, including job title and email address (10-15 words)
- Your social media handle and website address

Article word limit: 1,000 words

Please include references and details of any relevant further reading

Format

Submissions to be sent in English, as a Word document without graphics

Please include a minimum of three images, to be supplied as:

- Digital scans saved as TIFF or JPEG files, resolution 300dpi at A4 size
- Please don't forget to include captions and credits.
